# THE “ART” OF CHANGE

## Message from Mike Elwood, President of the Board of Directors

2020 was a year like no other. Many things have changed, but not all is bad. For most of us, we have been compelled to think and act differently. We have reimagined things we once took for granted. Our perspectives on life and the ways in which we relate to the world are evolving. In my humble opinion, I believe this time of change will eventually become a long-term positive, and I see a very real opportunity for the Arts Council to play an increasingly important role in that evolution. Our once high-touch world of in-person exhibits, public talks, artist-led workshops and youth art initiatives had to adapt.

We needed to think differently, and we did. The opportunity was to reimagine the role of arts and culture in our community. A new “go-to-market” or engagement model was in order to better connect with our community and deliver art that was both inspired by, and relevant to, current needs. We needed to flip our traditional model – no longer could we rely on people coming to the arts, we needed to take the arts to the people.

A few highlights from last year: we redesigned and transitioned much of our traditional programming to digital platforms; hosted our first ever global online Art & Design Auction to promote and celebrate the talents of our local artists; and last, led a highly successful public/private partnership to fund and help create locally designed, art-inspired face coverings to help with the pandemic. Talk about a real mobile exhibit!

So, what has 2020 taught us, and how we will take it forward? Perhaps most important, we were inspired to think differently about where and how art intersects with life. We have discovered new, exciting and enduring ways for the Columbus Area Arts Council to better engage with our community in more purposeful, relevant ways. There has never been a better time for The “Art” of Change!









# PARTNERSHIPS

## Cultural District Management

In partnership with the City of Columbus, Columbus Area Visitors Center, and downtown organizations and business, CAAC helps coordinate programming in the Columbus Arts & Entertainment District. Columbus is one of ten Indiana Cultural Districts recognized by the Indiana Arts Commission. The IAC provides project funding for designated Indiana Cultural Districts, facilitates statewide collaboration through the Indiana Cultural District Consortium, and provides other capacity-building opportunities for cultural district leadership.

## Public Art Management

In partnership with the City of Columbus, CAAC coordinates the Mayor's Public Art Committee. With membership of local artists and representatives from arts and civic organizations, this group reviews and considers new proposals and works with the community to gather feedback on public art projects in Columbus.

## CMAD Grant Program

In the Spring and Fall 2020 grant cycles, CAAC partnered with the Columbus Museum of Art & Design (CMAD) to award grants to local artists. These grants focused on projects that responded to the COVID-19 outbreak by engaging the Columbus community through public visual art and design projects and experiences.

# PARTNERSHIPS

## 6th Street Arts Alley

Strategically located in downtown Columbus, CAAC has been active in the development of 6th Street as a creative hub and budding Arts Alley. In 2020, CAAC teamed with LAA Office to transform this area into a flexible space for relaxation, informal gatherings and events. With close proximity to art and cultural organizations and local businesses, the urban activation project is shaping 6th Street as a site for programs and community activities at the heart of the city.

## 16th Street Neighborhood Asphalt Art Project

In 2020, Columbus was awarded a grant by Bloomberg Philanthropies as part of the Asphalt Art Initiative. A collaboration of the City of Columbus, CAAC and Columbus Regional Health–Healthy Communities, the asphalt artwork was planned as a ground-plane mural on 16th Street at the intersections of Home Avenue and Union Street, near a residential neighborhood and budding commercial node. Delayed with consideration for public health, in 2021 an artist team of Cory Robinson and Shamira Wilson was selected by a committee of neighborhood residents and business owners, and the project was completed in May 2021.
