# **Creative Placemaking**


Placemaking projects strengthen the connection between people and the places they share.

By merging art and culture with public spaces, we enhance quality of life, stimulate economic growth, and foster a strong sense of belonging.




#### PERFORMANCES

## **Placemaking Partnerships**



#### ASPHALT ART INITIATIVE

CAAC, in partnership with the City of Columbus and Columbus Regional Health, identified 16th Street as an ideal location for an Asphalt Art project. This temporary project increased pedestrian safety and social connectivity in the neighborhood.

#### A CAROUSEL FOR COLUMBUS

CAAC volunteers joined Could Be Design in painting the mural for the public art installation, *A Carousel for Columbus*. This Exhibit Columbus project was produced in collaboration with Columbus Museum of Art & Design. We collaborate with community partners and businesses to integrate art across our entire city.



## MAYOR'S PUBLIC ART COMMITTEE

CAAC co-leads this initiative in partnership with the City of Columbus. The committee is tasked with stewarding the community's public art collection through public and private support. We ensure best practices regarding the acquisition, creation, installation, maintenance, and insurance coverage of public art.





#### PUBLIC ART LONGEVITY FUND

CAAC's Public Art Longevity Fund provides dollars for the preservation and maintenance of our community's public art assets.









## Grants

#### INDIANA ARTS COMMISSION **REGIONAL ARTS PARTNER** FOR REGION 9

Through dynamic partnerships with the Indiana Arts Commission (IAC) and Columbus Museum of Art & Design, we provide funding opportunities for creative projects and arts organizations.

Annually, an average of \$65,000 is awarded to arts organizations and projects in Columbus and an additional \$121,000 in the Indiana Arts Commission's Region 9.

The Columbus Area Arts Council is one of eleven Regional Partners charged with implementing a statewide initiative developed by the Indiana Arts Commission. CAAC serves as the Regional Arts Partner for Region 9, representing Bartholomew, Dearborn, Decatur, Franklin, Jackson, Jennings, Ohio, Ripley, and Switzerland counties.

Ethnic Expo, hosted by the City of Columbus, is supported through CAAC and IAC grants.


