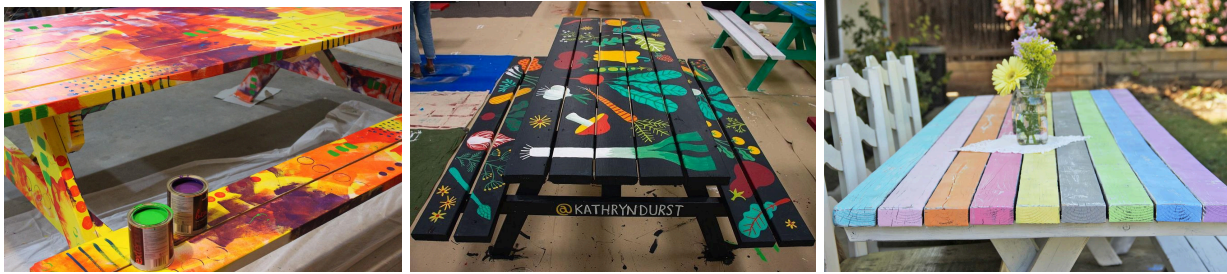


Artist-Designed Picnic Tables

For Heritage Fund's 2024 Love Where You Live Campaign



In partnership with [Heritage Fund](#), [Columbus Area Arts Council](#) (CAAC) is currently seeking four designers or artists to paint (or otherwise enhance) [classic wooden picnic tables](#). Artists must reside in Bartholomew County, Indiana.

The painted picnic tables will be featured at Heritage Fund's "Love Where You Live" celebration. During the event, attendees will enjoy and use the tables, which will be auctioned off, with all proceeds benefiting the Heritage Fund's Community Fund.

Scope of Work

Tables will be assembled for artists to paint at Columbus Propeller. Artists can access basic acrylic paints, brushes, and rollers and use CAAC's Studio C space at Propeller to store their materials. Artists may collaborate with others as they see fit.

Selected artists must submit a short bio (less than 50 words) and a statement (50-200 words) about their table design to bhawkins@artsincolumbus.org.

Stipend

Each artist will be paid \$500 to cover time and additional materials not provided by CAAC.

Timeline

- 9/4 Deadline to submit participation interest
- 9/5 Tables delivered and assembled at Propeller
- 9/6 Artists notified of whether they were selected to participate
- 9/9 Artists begin painting
- 9/30 Artists complete painting
- 9/30 Artists submit a short bio and statement about their table
- 10/5 Love Where You Live event

Participation Interest

The application process for this project is informal. Email a description of your approach to this project to bhawkins@artsincolumbus.org. (Examples could include a brief written description, a mood board, or a rendering of your concept.) You may also include a CV, portfolio, or social media links, but that is optional.
